

MLA Apok Jamir, who

trained that for India, as the largest democracy in the world with the second largest population of diverse people, an environment of peace was vital. Diversity makes it important to create peace, he said, while adding his belief that no religion subscribed to the violence which was being committed by a handful of misguided elements in the name of religion.

He also conveyed the need to change oneself first before embarking on the venture to change others. Bishop of Kohima, Rt. Rev. Jose Mukald D, the patron of the program, expounded on the need to have a proper

relationship with God, the source of peace, in order to properly receive peace in our lives.

The Inter-Faith Prayer Meeting, which also coincided with the Foundation day of Peace Channel, saw the giving away of Peace Awards, to five Nagas in recognition of their exemplary contribution towards conflict resolution, violence reduction and peace building in their immediate community.

Awardees of the Peace Award

1. Mrs. Christina Thone of Tobi village received the Peace Award for her intervention which diverted violence when her house was vandalised and burned down by miscreants in the wee hours of March 8, 2008, in relation to Nagaland General Assembly election. The men, especially the youth of the village, had been ready to retake at the vandalising of their Village Chairman's house, when Christina pleaded and reasoned with them that none of their family members had been hurt. Thus, the spilling of blood was averted and the men returned with firing a single bullet.
2. Mr. L.P. Therie, a GB of Diphupar B Village, was the man behind the end of violence and speedy normalisation of the tense situation when intermittent factional clashes threatened the calm of the locality in April and May this year. Constantly acting as a buffer between the administration, police, the villagers and leaders of both the warring factions, he persuaded people to bring a solution to the problem.
3. Mrs. Mary Konyak of Photor Village, Melur, was responsible for averting a major crisis when two children were killed and five others injured when an iron gate collapsed on the children who were playing in the Church lawn. It was Mary's children who were killed, but when a mob gathered at the sight and charged the authority for oversight, Mary, a teacher in the village, took on herself the death of the children saying that if she had gone to church on that particular day, which was a Sunday, she would have stopped them from playing outside. This reasoning from the main victim defused the situation.
4. Mrs. Ahimsa Zhimo of Diphupar B Village had showed great courage and leadership during the April-May stand-off between the two underground factions in her locality leading to the de-escalation of the tense situation. Ahimsa was instrumental in bringing together the womenfolk of the village together to make their stand against the violence and making the factions leave the village. She also courageously led the women group during clashes, beating drums and shouting slogans for peace, and faced the gun-totting men and appealed to them to leave the village.

Rev. Phugphoto Ayewondi, that at this point in time, when the Naga house is so divided, should 'any kind of solution' be offered by the Centre, if it would be acceptable to the Nagas.

Another member of the forum, Akum Longchari while considering the present turmoil in the country, pointed out that unless India deals with its own history, it is in no way prepared to engage on issues such as the Naga and Kashmir conflicts in a way that will lead towards any solution. "Only a strong India can bring a solution... but what we have today is an India which is not strong in that sense and is still trying to address the burdens of its own history as

a result of which, rather than resolving political issues, it has sufficiently confined itself to 'managing' the problem, not solving it", stated Akum Longchari. Seeking to refrain from 'saying too much' on the question, convener of the forum, Rev. Dr. Wati Ater stressed on the need to avoid all exclusivities and urged all to be inclusive as the goal in current pursuits is a united vision.

According to the director of peace channel, Fr. CP Anto, the festival was organized with the purpose to strengthen unity and re-

ferent religions, to honour and facilitate the Forum for Naga Reconciliation for their tireless efforts towards peace-building in the state and through interaction with the members, to motivate the young members of the Peace Channel.

In course of the interaction, Rev. Dr. Wati Ater also conveyed the message that the greatest threat to the reconciliation and peace process was myth-making and rumors. Many people in the Naga "political groups" have been killed by rumors, he said in allegory. While urging the Naga people to

be very careful and be aware of rumors, he underscored the need to be careful of a third force in the Naga political struggle. The need for people's support and participation in the reconciliation process was emphasized for achieving the dream and goal for a reconciled Naga people and land.

In his keynote address, the convener also informed the gathering on the present status of the reconciliation process. Despite the distance covered so far, it is gaiving trust which is proving a difficult task, he said. The Naga "political

groups" had taken the risk to talk to each other outside the country and had also met six times in Nagaland besides participating in two Naga Reconciliation soccer matches. He said the process needed time as clarifications from all the groups needed sorting out, he said. Dr. Wati urged the people to be patient. "The political groups need to come together and sort out their wounds before a third party which is the Forum for Naga Reconciliation", he reminded.

The reverend also opined that all forms of rationalization and justification are suicidal for the Nagas and confessing one's weaknesses and acknowledging ones mistakes is essential. Rev. Dr. Wati also firmly reiterated that 'Reconciliation' did not mean becoming one or one group merging with the other but that reconciliation has to be with each other while each group remained where it is.

The convener added that at some later stage if the different political groups wish to take the process further and to a higher level, it would be their decision.




